Joe Grainger (Gloucester Blazers) has worked with six teachers in basketball lessons and also ran a lunchtime club.

The PE co-ordinator completed and wrote up a PE learning walk in which he observed approximately 12 PE lessons across the school.

Sports Premium money has been spent on topping up spare PE kit, football kit, buying new rubber feet for the gymnastics tables, and renewing our membership of the school's tennis association in

time for the summer. It has also enabled us to buy new PE equipment such as: Dance ribbons, pompoms, basketball, cones, hoops and bean bags.

An assessment format for curriculum PE has been designed by the PE team and will be rolled out across the school in the 2016-17 school year.

A Gymnastics coach from University of Gloucestershire has run 10 weekly sessions to encourage girls to engage in physical activity in school.

A coach from Gloucestershire Football Association has worked with 3 teachers in football PE lessons as well as running a lunchtime club.

Adam Toulson (Oxstalls Tennis Centre) has worked with 1 teacher in Tennis lessons.

Ross Tominey (Chance To Shine) has worked with 2 teachers in Cricket as well as running a lunchtime club.

A team of Year 5/6 children took part in a Rounder's tournament at Ribston High School.

A team of Year 4 children took part in a Football tournament at Oxstalls University.

A team of Year 3/4 children won both the district and county tennis finals.

A team of Year 3-6 children took part in an Athletics competition at Prince of Wales Stadium and won several individual medals.
