Welcome back. The children have settled into their new theme 'Boom, Splash & Shake' which is all about natural disasters around the world. They are all looking forward to a visit from the Explorer Dome next week where they will learn more about Volcanos.

News: We have had a very exciting first week back exploring our new science- based theme of 'In a Galaxy far, far away.'

This week we have been looking at the relative sizes of the planets in our solar system and had a lot of fun reenacting this with different objects on the school playground. Using a peppercorn to represent Mercury and a large
umbrella to represent the sun really helped the children appreciate the relative size differences between the
planets. We calculated the relative distances of the planets apart from each other and realised that if we were to
include the dwarf planet Pluto in our model, we would need to stand in Kingsholm Stadium! The children have worked
really hard this week to research facts and answer questions about the planets in our solar system and it has been
lovely to see them posing lots of their own questions about the planets surrounding us. They are very curious about
the universe we live in and very keen to share their interesting facts with the class.

The children have created some fantastic pieces of 'space art' inspired by the artist Peter Thorpe with bright vibrant colours and their own space designs.
